

The garden is busy at present. Many birds are singing and coming to the garden to feed. I have noted a few young birds, such as a Blackbird which is easily recognizable with its spottier appearance or a Goldfinch that lacks the colourful head of its parents. I am sorry that the Blue Tits decided to go elsewhere to nest, probably because House Sparrows usurped their potential home, but they come regularly to the fat balls and take the proceeds back to their offspring. I put out cheese for the Blackbird and Robin, but a Magpie often intervenes.

Among the insects, there are plenty of bumblebees coming to flowers, and I have the chance to study mining bees covered in pollen. Wasps at this stage are not a nuisance and seem to prefer the flowers of gorse and pyracantha. Butterflies unfortunately are few in number, so I take pleasure in the odd passing Orange Tip. However, the most fascinating observation at the micro scale is of something that at first glance appears static. My attention is drawn to a small, dark, round object suspended among some geranium flowers. It seems like a strange seed head, but as I touch it the shape bursts open and tiny individuals flee in a ray of activity. Quickly, I realize that these are spiderlings that have recently hatched out. What I had not noticed was that there are thin threads linking the bundle with the surrounding plant. Having fetched a magnifying glass, I am intrigued to discover more.

The tiny spiders are pale yellow in colour and have an irregular, dark triangular mark on the abdomen. There must be at least three hundred. They are the young of the Garden, or Diadem Spider, noted for the obvious white cross on the adults. It is an orb web spider and a female will moult eight times before full growth in August. The male is smaller and when attempting to mate he must avoid her bite. If he succeeds, he will go in search of another female and does not mate with the same one twice. Unfortunately, he may not

survive an encounter and will get bitten and enshrouded as a future meal. As for the female she will leave her web in the autumn to lay eggs in one mass anchored to surrounding surface by short threads. She will then remain by the side of her offspring, no longer eating and will eventually die.

As for my spiderlings, I notice that a short while later they are back in their ball. At this stage there is no incentive to feed because they can access food from the yolk in their abdomen. However, by the next day, with no parent for guidance they have gone in order to set up homes of their own. Most will not survive, having to sustain the onslaught of bad weather, starvation and predators. Yet, maybe in two or three-months' time, I might come across a spider sitting head down in the centre of her intricate web and ponder whether she might be one of the lucky survivors from the tiny ball that I disturbed.

## **News from New County Hall**

The news from New County Hall at the moment is centring around the impending idea of a Mayor for Cornwall, or as it might be called a Directly Elected Leader for Cornwall. The name doesn't really matter actually, it is more about what it means for our Duchy.

At the moment the Governance of Cornwall Council is that of a "strong leader and cabinet" model, in other words, the leader of the Council is chosen by the Political Group that has the most elected members on the Council – that might not be from the Political Party that I personally would want to see leading the Council, but it is the Political Party that garnered the most amount of votes in our Local Election in 2021 and that, I believe is just and democratic.

If we were to move to a directly elected Leader, or Mayor, or whatever else the role may be called, that individual may be from any political party or something completely left-field; Hartlepool elected a football team mascot when they first did a similar thing!

So why the proposed change? In a nutshell it is being billed as a way for us to get more devolution and potentially better funding for Cornwall – to possibly allow us to make more decisions around planning, education, transport and so on; these are all items that the leaders of Cornwall Council are trying to get for us in the negotiations with Central Government that are underway now; we won't find out until later in the year what that deal looks like, and that is when this will come to all Councillors at Cornwall Council for us to vote on.

One of the main questions that keeps coming up, however, is if we can have these powers and funding, why do we need another layer of Government and Bureaucracy to get them? Why can't central Government give us these powers and funding anyway? As another Cornwall Councillor has said, "it seems like a sprat to catch a mackerel" but, as with so many things, time will tell when we see the details of the offer.

### **Practice News**

Thank you to those patients who have donated towards a gift for Dr Penny Thomson's retirement in April. Dr Thomson has now delayed her retirement date to coincide with a new GP joining the practice at the end of June.

We are slowly opening up our waiting rooms in the surgery, which in turn gives us the ability to offer more face-to-face appointments with the GPs. You may be asked by the reception team which type of appointment you prefer if asking to see a GP. It is still a requirement to wear a face covering in 'all' healthcare settings.



Please be mindful that our surgery closes on Bank Holidays and will be closed on Thursday 2nd June and Friday 3rd June. When ordering medication, you must allow a minimum of '5 working days' for your prescriptions to be ready to collect. This does not include Bank Holidays or weekends.

Throughout the pandemic we have had to be creative and look at new and innovative ways of working. Telephone consultations are very popular with patients and work well for GPs too, as it isn't always necessary to see a patient in person. Recruiting GPs into General Practice is very difficult and whilst face to face appointments with the GPs remains an important core part of our work, we are having to look at new ways of working to enable us to provide a holistic service to our patients. To maintain our service and manage the high demand for appointments we will be utilising the help from remote GP services.

### **Downderry and Seaton Residents' Association**

Local Downderry and Seaton Ukrainian Refugee Support Group coordinator Leanne Spencer-Harper has been contacted by two hosts who found out about the Group through Nut Tree which means two more Ukrainian families have now been able to find hosts in the village! And many more people have contacted her about ways to help, or joined the Group's Facebook page - see below. Leanne is appreciative of residents' continued support for Ukrainians in need. There are now 6 Ukrainian families safely housed with hosts in Downderry, Seaton and St Germans, and a few more families will be arriving shortly. There are currently over 40 Ukrainians living in and around Deviock Parish and they are connecting with other Ukrainians being hosted in nearby Looe. One of our new Ukrainian residents recently organised a successful BBQ meet-up on Seaton Beach, and more meetings will be planned so that local residents can welcome Ukrainians, and Ukrainians can connect with one another.

As the Ukrainian conflict becomes more protracted, there now seem to be more Ukrainians in need of accommodation than available UK hosts. If you have registered with the Homes for Ukraine Scheme please be aware that the government will not proactively match you with a family. Whilst it is important to make sure you register for the government scheme, if you would like to be a sponsor, the most expedient route for connecting with Ukrainians is through personal networks and contacts. Our local Support Group has already a good network in place and requests for UK sponsors are flooding in, so if you have registered with the scheme or if you can offer accommodation, please do be in touch with Leanne Spencer-Harper at leanneronk@yahoo.com or by mobile: 07895 804935. Two-bedroom accommodation is at a particular premium. Leanne says "It's breaking our heart to turn away families for lack of available UK sponsors. Please know that there is an incredibly savvy and supportive local network. If you've got the space, don't let bureaucracy and paperwork prevent you from offering much-needed stability, safety and comfort. We're here to help!"

Do you have an unwanted laptop, phone or tablet in working condition that can be reformatted and refurbished? The Support Group has connected with a local charity that will reformat and refurbish the computers and phones so that we can disseminate them to Ukrainians in need. Please be in touch with Laura Chapman at lsmith8836@gmail.com if you can help. We are hoping to begin local English classes from mid-June.

## St Germans and Area Public Transport Group

A Public Bus Meeting covering the St Germans, Downderry, Hessenford and Rame areas will be held in the Memorial Hall, Crafthole on Monday 20th June from 6:00pm. It will be attended by Mel Watson (Lead Officer for Public Transport in Cornwall), James Church (Commercial & Customer Manager, Go South West buses) and Kate Ewert (Cornwall Councillor for Rame and St Germans Division).

How have the April bus changes affected you? We've had about two months to see how the changes have been working. Some people lost their buses altogether. This meeting is an opportunity to hear what Cornwall Council officers/representatives and a Go Cornwall Bus manager have to say. You'll be able to ask your questions and have your say about routes, connections, timings, fares etc. We know that there have been a number of complaints about the new services, and that some of you have contacted Cornwall Council and Go Cornwall Bus already. Our area has also lost out on the much-publicised Cornwall Reduced Bus Fares Scheme, as it does not apply to journeys into Plymouth.

There will also be an opportunity to hear about the progress of the Public Transport Survey which has been asking people in the whole of the Rame, Downderry and St Germans areas about what journeys they make by public transport, what journeys they CAN'T make (and why), and what sorts of integrated public transport they would like to see in the future.

It is extremely important that the public meeting is very well supported, so that we can get a much-improved bus service that will help our communities who are dependent on using public transport. We are hoping to arrange for a community bus service to and from Crafthole for this meeting. Keep in touch.
